### Your guide to joining Neighbourhood Watch

Joining Neighbourhood Watch is free and will allow you to become part of our National Watch which has over two million members. Following this step by step guide will also help you to become a member of an existing Neighbourhood Watch scheme in your locality.

### Joining Neighbourhood Watch

1. Go to [www.ourwatch.org.uk](http://www.ourwatch.org.uk)
2. On the the website home page click on the Join Us button.
3. This will open the Join Us page.
4. The Join Us page will request some basic details and ask you to agree the privacy policy.
5. You will be sent an email which will welcome you to Neighbourhood Watch. This will contain a temporary password and other details to allow you to log in as a member of Neighbourhood Watch.
6. Once logged in you can complete the registration process.

Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch Association works in partnership with communities and many professional agencies to help prevent crime and support the wellbeing of our communities.

Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch Association Districts



All approved local Neighbourhood Watch Schemes are located in one of six Neighbourhood Watch Districts in the Peterborough and Cambridgeshire Combined Authority area.

Each district is part of the Cambridgeshire Neighbourhood Watch Association (CNWA) which is guided by an executive committee with representation from districts and the police. The CNWA boundaries match the boundaries of Cambridgeshire Constabulary Force area. This structure gives us the flexibility to match the diversity of our districts whilst providing the unity needed to achieve our aims of supporting safer and stronger communities.



### Joining Your Local Scheme

Neighbourhood Watch schemes aim to reduce crime and improve wellbeing. They support the community with crime prevention information, and can significantly improve safety and wellbeing in their community.

1. Go to [www.ourwatch.org.uk](http://www.ourwatch.org.uk)
2. Click on Login top right using your username and password.
3. This will open your details page.
4. Choose the Neighbourhood Watch Tools option from the menu and click on Join or Create Scheme.
5. This will give you the names of any schemes nearby. Click JOIN to open the registration page, respond to the sign me up now or later and click the yellow button with the scheme name displayed.
6. You will now have joined the scheme as a Full Member of Neighbourhood Watch and will be able to receive messages from the scheme coordinator.

If there are no schemes in your area then you can apply to create a new scheme using the create scheme options and following the instructions on screen.
